With a new look and feel, clevercare, info serves as a real tool to find useful advice and new simple habits to help consumers > to preserve the quality of their clothes and improve their lifespan - while also saving energy and contributing to the reduction of their environmental footprint.

With its new ergonomics, the website offers smoother navigation, but especially, it is equipped with new sections to help consumers know all about textile eco-care and help them learn how to adopt better laundry practices.

#### **NEW FEATURES INCLUDE:**

- A special search tool to find out how to get rid of a stain on a garment, according to the type of stain and type of textile.
- An index of eco-care tips per fabric, with advice on how to wash, dry or iron the garment.
- A guide to the textile care symbols on the labels, to understand their meaning a boost for consumers, given that 73 % of Europeans say they follow the care instructions on their labels.

The modern convenience of washing machines has made manual laundering unnecessary for many types of garments. Nev-





# ISO 3758: 2023 standard published



- some exemptions have been introduced > into the Scope:
- a new symbol has been introduced for > wash by hand at ambient temperature in Table 1;

- a new symbol has been introduced for ironing without steam in Table 5;
- new solvents have been introduced in Table 6;
- graphical changes have been introduced in symbols of wash by hand, do not wash (in Table 1), do not bleach (in Table 2) and do not iron (in Table 5), in order to align them with GINETEX symbols;
- three alternative examples of use of symbols have been introduced in 5.3;
- a new Annex D, "Adaptation of registered graphical symbols for use in practice", has been added.

# EU Textile fibre Labelling Regulation N°1007


The EUTLR N° 1007 revision has been launched in the framework of the EU textile sustainability strategy.

In March 2022, the European Commission presented an EU strategy for sustainable and circular textiles. The strategy is part of the 2020 circular economy action plan and includes in particular actions under the new regulation on ecodesign requirements for sustainable products and the new directive empowering consumers for the green transition directive.

Part of this strategy, the Commission will revise the Textile fibre Labelling Regulation (EU) 1007 to introduce specifications for physical and digital labelling of textiles, including sustainability and circularity parameters based on requirements under the proposed Regulation on eco-design for sustainable products.

The Regulation has worked well in the last decade and has delivered its main objectives. Today, this initiative revises EU textile > labelling rules by introducing comprehensive requirements on the physical and digital

labelling of textiles and related products. It addresses shortcomings in the current rules as well as diverging labelling requirements between Member States.



THE EU COMMISSION'S MAIN OBJECTIVES ARE TO:

Ensure accurate, comprehensive and comparable information to consumers, notably on relevant environmental as-

pects introducing physical and digital labels for textile products.

- > Reduce compliance costs
- > Ensure regulatory clarity and consistency

Today, the revision aims at modernising a few key aspects: Increasing efficiency and effectiveness to facilitate harmonisation within Europe and updating some aspects to today's situation.

GINETEX is in favour of positioning the main care instructions, valid all along the lifespan of the textile, directly visible on the product label to avoid any irreversible damages.

"Care instructions provide valuable guidance on how to properly clean and maintain the product, ensuring its longevity and preserving its quality, also in a perspective of reducing environmental impact. Sustainability and product durability are key challenges for our industry, regulation decision on textile labelling will play a key role", says Thomas Lange.

# NEWS FROM DOWN UNDER: AUSTRALIAN TEXTILE CARE LABELLING REGULATION

On September 5, 2023, Product Safety Australia published an announcement for the adoption of the ISO 3758 standard for mandatory textile care labelling.

> Adoption of the International Standard ISO 3758:2012 Textiles – Care labelling code using symbols in Australia becomes mandatory for textile products.

- The mandatory standard provides transition periods to assist suppliers to adjust to the new requirements.
  - From 5 September 2023 until 4 March 2024, suppliers must continue to provide a care label written in English but can additionally provide care symbols if they wish.
  - From 5 March 2024, suppliers can choose to provide a care label written in English or using the international care symbols, or both.

# INTERNATIONAL REGULATION UPDATE

Brands must comply with either AS/NZS 1957:1998 (in words) or ISO 3758:2012 (Care labelling code using symbols). This is very good news for our global textile and clothing industry: a further step towards sustainable international legislation and trade.

## **GENERAL PRODUCT SAFETY REGULATION (RSGP)**

From December 13, 2024, the current directive on General Product Safety and the directive on Products Resembling Foodstuffs (87/357/EEC) will be replaced by the new European regulation (EU) 2023/988 of May 10, 2023 on general product safety.

To define the scope of the General Product Safety Regulation, Article 2 states that it

applies "to products which are placed on the market or made available on the market."
